

Forms E/F and A/B Test and Composite Crosswalk



The following tables (Forms E/F and A/B Test and Composite Crosswalk) show the test score/composite score similarities between the new forms of the Iowa Assessments (Forms E and F) and the most recent forms of the ITBS and ITED (Forms A and B). The left columns of each table show the names of the test scores/composite scores for Form E/F while the right column shows the names of the test scores/composite scores for Form A/B. The center column displays the abbreviations for Form E/F test scores/composite scores that are used in the CD-Rom file layout (Iowa Testing Programs website -> Document Center -> CD-ROM Student Data Information).

A couple of notable differences between Forms E/F and A/B are:

- Levels 5/6 to 8
 - Sources of Information has been eliminated
- Levels 9 to 14
 - Maps and Diagrams and Reference Materials have been eliminated
 - Mathematics (two separately timed parts) has replaced Math Concepts and Estimation and Math Problem Solving and Data Interpretation
 - Conventions of Writing score added as a combination of Spelling, Capitalization, and Punctuation
- Levels 15 to 17/18
 - Spelling and Sources of Information have been eliminated
