## Part 2: College Readiness Benchmarks for Iowa Students

Figure 1 shows the percentage of examinees that met or exceeded the college readiness benchmark score on each of the four lowa Assessment tests.




Figure 2: Percent of Iowa Students who met or exceeded College Readiness Benchmarks in Reading

Figures 2-9 show the percentage of examinees <u>separated by gender, FRL, and race</u> that met or exceeded the college readiness benchmark score on each of the four lowa Assessment tests.

Figures 10-11 show the percentage of examinees, separated by the same groupings, that met or exceeded the college readiness benchmark scores on <u>all four</u> of the Iowa Assessment tests.

For the graphs that show performance by race, there are individuals of other ethnicities, such as those of Native American background, that also took the content area tests, but the size of the samples were too small to adequately represent average performance of these ethnic groups.

Figure 1: Percent of All Iowa Students who met or exceeded College Readiness Benchmarks




Figure 3: Percent of Iowa Students who met or exceeded College Readiness Benchmarks in Reading






Figure 4: Percent of Iowa Students who met or exceeded College Readiness Benchmarks in Written Expression




Figure 5: Percent of Iowa Students who met or exceeded College Readiness Benchmarks in Written Expression




Figure 6: Percent of Iowa Students who met or exceeded College Readiness Benchmarks in Mathematics




Figure 7: Percent of Iowa Students who met or exceeded College Readiness Benchmarks in Mathematics




Figure 8: Percent of Iowa Students who met or exceeded College Readiness Benchmarks in Science




Figure 9: Percent of Iowa Students who met or exceeded College Readiness Benchmarks in Science




Figure 10: Percent of Iowa Students who met or exceeded all College Readiness Benchmarks






Figure 11: Percent of Iowa Students who met or exceeded all College Readiness Benchmarks
